A new mascot

Have you seen the cartoon otter on the display boards at the North End of the car park? Siop Cynfelyn has adopted this character, called *Cletwr*, as the shop's mascot. Otters have occasionally been seen along the length of Cwm Clettwr, probably searching for fresh local food. They ought to visit the shop. There is plenty of fresh local food for sale there!



Working on a new menu. Our simple start-up fare of homemade hot savoury pastries with salad has been doing well. Now it is time to put more winter comforts on the menu. We have just taken delivery of new kitchen equipment, and volunteer cooks led by Jane Burnham (founder of the Treehouse) and Mike Smerdon (experienced catering lecturer) will be putting it to good use. They'll be developing soup recipes and homemade rolls and sandwiches — so drop in and try them out and let us know what you like.

A new space. Not too many people want to sit outside in the winter, so a team of volunteers are doing their best to transform the unused garage-shop area into an extra cafe space and function room. Work began on Sunday 17th November, with the clearout of a large volume of stored paraphernalia. Carpentry, electrics, painting and flooring will follow soon after. It's all being done on a shoestring budget, funded by small loans and input from volunteers. We hope to have it ready by early December in time for the Christmas wine-tasting on 6th. Come and check on progress – and do please offer your services if you have useful practical skills!

Planning for the future. This winter we are working with Machynlleth architects George and Tomos on plans for the

long-term: a spacious and welcoming shop and cafe, with room for interesting displays about our local heritage and for community events. Then in the spring we'll use these plans to support our bid for a grant from the Big Lottery to make it happen.

Rethinking our bid: petrol is off the menu. The company has done a lot of research into the pros and cons of petrol services, but we have now been informed by the Big Lottery, who we hope will be funding the project, that re-opening the petrol would make us ineligible for public funding. So now we're pursuing the option of purchasing and developing the site without petrol facilities.

Getting down to business. There was a good turnout from the community on October 6th for the first AGM of Cwmni Cymunedol Cletwr, which is responsible for Siop Cynfelyn. 

Food Bank Machynlleth now has a collection point in Siop Cynfelyn. Non-perishable food items can be left in the basket in the shop entrance. They are regularly collected and distributed to help people who are struggling to feed their families.

Recently we've entertained the drivers of a Tractor Run, with a colourful convoy starting from here with bacon sandwiches, and raising £110 for Welsh Air Ambulance; and a buzzing coffee morning that raised £370 for Macmillan.
